This project is sponsored and supported by the Italian government. It will help students obtain a one-month Schengen visa to enjoy summer school.

The total cost is a contribution to TBD , contact WeChat ID: SUMMERS-MARE (CNY/RMB), which includes all transportation expenses in Italy, airport pickup from Venice, accommodation, meals, and summer school fees.

Thanks to the generous donations from the Regional government and several supporting organizations, more than half of the expenses have been waived, making it more affordable compared to other similar summer international exchange programs. Without this support, the summer school would typically cost around 25,000 Chinese Yuan.

Certificate: SSV will provide a certificate of attendance and completion valid for credits as an Internship or workshop. The certification of achievements totaling 150 hours, including 100 hours of production and 50 hours of post-production.

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Background and Italian Partners:

The Region of Veneto (northern Italy, prominent city - Venice) is keen to promote tourism and create greater awareness of the historical and cultural significance of the area, particularly to Chinese people as the Chinese tourist industry develops and exerts ever greater influence on the world stage.



The Association of Walled Cities of Veneto was officially founded in January 1997 under the patronage of the Veneto Region with the aim of promoting initiatives aimed at their knowledge, protection, protection, conservation and enhancement.

Ca' Foscari University of Venice is a public university in Venice, Italy. Since its foundation in 1868, it has been housed in the Venetian Gothic palace of Ca' Foscari, from which it takes its name. The palace stands on the Grand Canal, between the Rialto and San Marco, in the sestiere of Dorsoduro. They are our partner institution.

The local Region of Veneto government and the Association Città Murate will support and cover for 11 days:

- Accommodation in university hostel (for max 30 students + 2 profs)
- Transportation in the Veneto Region (also bus to and from Venice Airport)
- Meals (breakfast, lunch and dinner)

Each City will provide local guides

University of Padua (Galileo's University) will provide classes, visit to important places and a few local, Italian film students who will support our 3 student teams.

Film Summer School Program

While at Universities, the students will be divided into film production teams (3-5 per team) and the instructors will hold a preparatory seminar to orient students to the locations, requirements, and expectations for our travel and time in Italy.

Over 10 days + 5 days of post production (remotely), students (in teams of 3 to 5) lead by the 2 teachers, local guides and local film school students, will explore various locations in northern Italy and film for the topic "The Italian walled cities". These are urban centers that have preserved, at least in part, the circle of defense walls built in prehistoric, Etruscan, Phoenician, Greek, Roman, Medieval or Renaissance times until the seventeenth century. Veneto is the premiere tourist region of Italy. This is due to the incredible variety of its history, beauty and charm, cultural identity, landscape and monuments.

One of the teams will film their project as a Virtual Reality project.

Every day begins with transport to and introduction of locations. Students then explore and shoot footage for their videos.

After returning to China, students finish their films over the summer according to their role on the team.

Films will be turned in the first week of class during the Fall semester.

Films will also be entered into the Venice Film Festival (one of the most prestigious festivals in the world.)

Programme Theme: The Italian walled cities

Tot. Duration: 10 days in July 2023 (proposed July 13-23)

Funding – the Italian government will support in-country expenses of housing and food.



Students are responsible for all other costs.

Visa – the Italian government will grant tourist visas for the students to travel.

Credit – students can receive 150 hours of credit toward the internship course.

Festival – students will attend the Euganee International Film Festival which focuses on short film and documentaries. It runs from July 15-20 in 2020, and their films will be entered into the Venice Film Festival (on July 19th Film Festival VIP meeting with young directors).




Special Guest Professor:









<u>Prof. Dario Marinelli</u> is professor at Kaunas University of Technology, and is also affiliated to the University of Helsinki.



THE BACKGROUND

Background to the realization of the project is the discovery, on fortuitous occasions, of a number of works, twenty including both paintings and sketches, by a Paduan painter, **Antonio Grinzato** (Padua, 1874-1926), an active artist of the beginning of the twentieth century and today little known due to the very limited number of his (known) works.

Grinzato was endowed with excellent artistic skills and perfectly inserted in the cultural context between the end of the nineteenth and the beginning of the twentieth century. During his activity, he took part to various national artistic exhibitions and his activity is particularly interesting for the artistic events that they interested Padua in that period.

Padua, in fact, despite suffering from the excessive proximity to Venice and therefore suffering in some way the liveliness and importance of the artistic climate that radiated from the lagoon city, was interested, at the beginning of the century, by the co-presence of some of the most relevant to Italian painting of this period: Felice Casorati, Umberto Boccioni and Ugo Valeri, Mario Cavaglieri, to whose artistic events Antonio Grinzato was also tied up.

THE PROJECT

The unexpected discovery, after a century of silence, of Antonio Grinzato's works , offers both the opportunity to shed some light on a painter of considerable ability and to shed further light on the pictorial history of Padua at the beginning of the twentieth century. This discovery also shows the influence on one of the most important Italian artists of the time, such as Felice Casorati, offering the opportunity to make a big project of recovery intercultural .

The design ambition, in fact, is to make young people from different systems and cultures live and share experiences of discovery, study, recovery, restoration, protection, enhancement and dissemination, as elements of an artistic culture able to unite, because linked to absolute and therefore common and collective themes.

The discovery of the works, which had been lying for almost a century in the cellar of a house surely linked to the painter or to his heirs, has the characteristics of a history of other times: acquired, together with the other materials present in the cellar, by a second-hand dealer local, ended up, anonymous and in poor condition, in his warehouse, where, covered with poor and forgotten again, they were, by chance, recognized in their real artistic interest and immediately purchased.

From this point the background ends and the project begins. The works are still in the study where they have immediately been moved after the discovery and the purchase and, due to their storage conditions, were not even clean and they had a first catalogue.

The project includes: the transfer of the works to a qualified restoration laboratory, the preconsolidation, cleaning and restoration of the works, their analysis through diagnostic investigations carried out by a specialized laboratory of an Italian university, the study of the works by a highly qualified art historian and specialized in early twentieth century painting, who for a long time dealt with the great painters who worked in Padua in this period.

Students from Italian and Chinese universities will participate in all phases of the project as didactic activity. The project foresees the participation of the students in all the theoretical and practical phases of the analyzes and interventions.

This will be followed by the organization of an exhibition, in one of the exhibition venues of the Municipality of Padua, and the publication of a catalogue in Italian, English and Chinese.

At the same time, Chinese students and teachers will organize an exhibition in China, where the works will be temporarily transferred and exhibited.

All the phases, starting from the transfer of the works to the restoration laboratory, will be the subject of film shots made by the students, in order to produce a documentary, also in three languages, to be

projected within the exhibition and associated with the catalogue to be disseminated in the media, as an example of international cooperation on universal issues.

Filming will be carried out in Italy and it will document all the phases of the project: the restoration, the study, the drafting of the multilingual catalogue, the design and preparation of the exhibition until its inauguration. From abroad it will be possible to participate both in presence (from 2022) for the groups of foreign students who will temporarily live in Italy, and also via the web from participating universities, interacting directly during the entire cultural and implementation process of the event. In 2021 the shooting will be made by Italian students who will work, in collaboration, with Chinese colleagues. The project will therefore continue in 2022 and will end with the design and preparation of the exhibition in the Italian and foreign locations and the following transfer, according to the pre-established calendar, of the works to the various exhibition locations. Groups of Italian students, who will temporarily live in the participating countries, may also participate in the set-up phases in foreign locations.

The project will include documentation and the possibility of participation, direct or virtual, in all phases of analysis, restoration and study, up to the preparation and realization of the exhibitions.

Students will participate to the entire process and to all phases of the project, from the current location of the works after the purchase to the restoration laboratory, where, in addition to the documentation of the analysis and restoration activities and the illustration and sharing of choices, both philosophical and restoration techniques, it will be possible for some students to actively participate, as interns, in the restoration operations.

In Italy, various public and private actors will participate in the project: the organization of the project will be curated by Massimiliano D'Ambra, Teresa De Gregorio, Vincenzo De Masi, Gianlorenzo Martini and Maurizio Rossi, of the cultural association for the promotion of international cultural relationships IN-BETWEEN. Città Murate of Veneto will take part in the project, as part of the already existing program of bilateral Italy-China relations. The art historian Virginia Baradel will be responsible for the study of the works. The restoration interventions will be guided by the restorer Giovanna Niero, the chemical-physical investigations for the realization of the restorations and for the analysis of the degradation and painting techniques will be carried out by the investigation laboratory of the Art Department of the University Venice, the video documentation of the activities will be made by the students of the various foreign and Italian participating universities, the exhibition design will be carried out by Archeo Ed engineering.

The project, which can be replicated in any socio-cultural context, will pave the way to the preservation and international sharing of knowledge and good practices.

THE PROGRAM

- Identification of the historical context and cultural background in which the paintings were made.
- The study of the works from the historical-artistic point of view.
- TRANSPORT at the restoration laboratory, after pre-consolidation if necessary and safety of the works with appropriate packaging.
- Analysis of degradation and materials for the restoration project of the paintings.
- Mapping of degradation with a graphic program to highlight the problems of the works is the various damages suffered in time.
- Study of the artistic techniques used by the author also through specific diagnostic tests.



- Invasive and non-invasive diagnostics and analysis for the study of the materials used by the artist and for the drafting of the restoration project.
- Restoration design.
- Consolidation test of the supports and of the pictorial film and subsequent application to the restoration.
- Surface improvement with the help of the low pressure table.
- Support lining or reinforcement techniques.
- Test surface cleaning paintings.
- Cleaning steps.
- Phases of integration of the surface and the mimetic pictorial material, chromatic with colors of a specific synthesis.
- Study of painting with aliphatic paints of a specific synthesis.
- Study of the framing for exhibition purposes.

Students will take the lessons carried out by experts and professors in the field of restoration.

Students should preferably be enrolled in art faculties or have attended courses in art history, painting and restoration in previous years .

Art materials and their classification focusing on paintings (i.e. how a painting is made; what is the difference between a dye and a pigments, what is a binder)

General introduction to the analytical methods for the materials characterization: Invasive and non-invasive methodologies with practical examples

The importance of the analytical methods to identify the materials of a work of art: what kind of information is obtained with the different techniques.

Day 6: July 18

Experimental work

Practical sections will be done on the three artworks starting from the non-invasive techniques: observation in visible and UV light, observation with digital microscope; use of raking light etc. This part is fundamental to a preliminary study of the paintings and to select possible area of interest. Data already collected will be also presented and commented with the participants.

Question time will be also given to the participants.

Day 7: July 19

Lecture (09:00 – 13:00 Italian Time, 17:00 – 20:00 Beijing Time) Location – University Ca' Foscari Laboratory of Heritage Science

Experimental work

Spectroscopic analysis (Raman, Infrared and Spectrocolorimetry UV-VIS, Hyperspectral Imaging) will be done on the artwork in order to study the panting materials, understand possible degradation processes etc. Attention will be paid to understand how to optimize the data collected and select the significant points. Data already collected will be also discussed and evaluated with the participants. A cross section of one of the paintings will be also illustrated.

Question time will be also given to the participants.

Day 8: July 20

Structural Repair and Stabilization:

Techniques for repairing tears and losses in canvas or other support materials

Methods for stabilizing paint layers

Relining: This is a technique used to reinforce the support structure of a painting. A new canvas or other support material is attached to the back of the original support material using an adhesive. This helps to provide additional support and prevent further damage.

Patching: Small tears or holes in the canvas or other support material can be patched using a technique called inlaying. This involves creating a patch of canvas or other material that is shaped to match the tear and then adhering it to the back of the tear.

Infills: Infills are used to fill losses in the paint layer or other support material. A new material is inserted into the loss and then colored to match the surrounding area.

Consolidation: This is a technique used to stabilize flaking or unstable paint layers. An adhesive is applied to the unstable area, which helps to bind the layers together and prevent further flaking.

Humidification: In some cases, paint layers may be too dry or brittle, making them prone to cracking or flaking. Humidification is a technique used to reintroduce moisture to the paint layers, which can make them more pliable and easier to work with.

Support attachments: Support attachments are used to secure loose or detached support materials, such as paint layers, to the backing of the painting. This helps to prevent further damage and stabilize the structure of the painting.



Day 9: July 21

Final Touches and Finishing

Techniques for final varnishing and finishing of restored paintings

After the restoration work is completed, the painting will need to be varnished and finished. Here are some techniques that may be used for final varnishing and finishing, as well as some tips for caring for and handling restored paintings:

Varnishing: A final varnish is applied to the surface of the painting to provide protection and enhance the colors. There are various types of varnishes, including synthetic and natural resin-based varnishes. The choice of varnish depends on the painting's materials and the desired effect.

Framing: Once the varnish is dry, the painting can be framed. The frame should be chosen based on the style of the painting and should be made of materials that are stable and do not react with the painting's materials.

Day 10: July 22

Care and handling of restored paintings

Storage: Restored paintings should be stored in a controlled environment that is free from excessive humidity, heat, and direct sunlight. The painting should be kept in a stable, upright position and should not be leaned against a wall or stacked with other paintings.

Handling: When handling a restored painting, it is important to use clean, dry hands or gloves. The painting should be carried by the frame or stretcher bars, and should never be lifted by the canvas or paint layer. It is also important to avoid touching the surface of the painting with bare hands, as oils and acids from the skin can damage the paint layer.

Cleaning: Restored paintings should be dusted regularly with a soft, dry brush or microfiber cloth. If the painting needs to be cleaned, it should be done by a trained professional using appropriate techniques and materials.

Day 11: July 23

CONCLUSION:

All the different practical and experimental work will be discussed with the participants and the lecturers in order to understand how science, conservator, historian and art work mutually to help in preserving and conserving artworks.

Notes:

- a) The schedule is set to allow students to join the Euganee International Film Festival on July 18^{th} (Film Festival meeting with young directors) and on July 20^{th} .
- b) All the Summer School Veneto Studedts are inviting to Venice Film Festival (30 AUG 2023 9 SEPT 2023) for the presteations of videos, the presentation is only one day TBD and students the want to participate to the event have to arrange their schedule and support all the cost (the entrance in Venice Film Festival is free for Summer School Students and staff in in that day). We can provide to students help for logist and accommodation.
- c) If a student needs to take a Supplementary Final exam, then that student will not be allowed to participate in this summer program. They will be required to sign a form (see attached).



POLICY FOR Summer School 2020 7.15–7.26

Parents should be aware that school field trips are an important part and closely linked to the school curriculum.
